by any person of animals of his own raising, and the prep-1 2 aration by him and transportation in commerce of the car-3 casses, parts thereof, meat and meat food products of such 4 animals exclusively for use by him and members of his 5 household and his nonpaying guests and employees" and inserting "the slaughtering of animals by any person that 6 7 is an owner of the animals in whole or in part, or the 8 preparation or transportation in commerce of the car-9 casses or parts thereof or meat and meat food products 10 from those animals by an owner, if such slaughter, prepa-11 ration, or transportation is exclusively for the use of an 12 owner or the household, nonpaying guests, or employees 13 of an owner, subject to the condition that if an owner designates an agent to assist in such slaughter, preparation, 14 15 or transportation, the owner shall maintain custody and 16 specific identification of the carcasses or parts thereof or meat and meat food products, as determined by the Sec-17 retary". 18
