

IMPACT OF PRESIDENT TRUMP'S ECONOMIC POLICIES

On average, families in Vermont will lose \$2,120 every year

274,200 Vermont families—99.5% of all Vermont families—will lose money under President Trump's tariffs and his so-called "Big Beautiful Bill."

HEALTH CARE

- As many as 45,000 Vermonters expected to lose their health care.
- \$1.7 billion in lost revenue for Vermont hospitals.
- Over 8,000 Vermonters at risk of losing access to substance use treatment.
- Over 26,000 Vermonters will lose access to discounted premiums on the ACA marketplace.

HEALTHY FOOD

- 6,000 Vermonters at risk of losing some or all of their SNAP assistance.
- 600 Vermont retailers and farms at 40+ farmers markets that accept SNAP will lose business due to cuts.
- Average family in Vermont losing food assistance will lose \$94 every month.

CLIMATE CHANGE

- Annual energy bills for Vermonters will rise by \$290.
- 1,400 Vermont jobs lost by ending green energy projects.
- Vermont families who invest in energy efficiency upgrades in their homes will pay \$880 more on average.
- Vermont families will lose out on tax credits for upgrades that would help save an average of \$2,590 a year on energy bills.

RAISING COSTS

- Mortgage payments will rise by \$1,060 annually.
- New loans for more than 75,000 small businesses in Vermont will rise \$860 a year.
- 78,000 Vermonters with student loans will pay \$3,694 more over the course their loans.
- President Trump's tariffs will cost Vermont households \$3,800 more on average per year.
